## Council minutes from May 25th, 2010

Members in Attendance: Betty Hembrook, Van Johnson, Kurt Kaempfer, Gloria Brinkmeier, Jennine Sonntag, Donna Winiarski, Lou Graef, Sandy Sannes and Pastor Michael Fazio.

**Secretary's Report:** Minutes from 4/27/10 were approved with changes.

**Treasurer's Report – Donna Winiarski:** July 1, 2010 is still the target date by which Nolan Accounting will begin to take over the accounting function.

**Pastor's Report:** There was a great turnout for the Dead Sea Scrolls field trip to the Milwaukee Public Museum. There is now a list of 14 people who are willing to serve in the nursery. Pastor sent out a letter to the 10 people who have not picked up their 2010 envelopes. Pastor has now completed his CPE program! He will now resume taking his day off on Fridays.

Pastor Fazio submitted a breakdown of all pastoral acts between 4/27/10 – 5/25/10 including: Led worship and preached 8 services; 8 hospital visits; 7 pastoral counseling appointments; 2 home visitations; 13 home/hospital communions; 35 pastoral phone calls; led Thursday evening Bible study; one healing service; one Baptism – Connor Braun, May 2; confirmed four 8<sup>th</sup> grade students as members of WPLC, May 16.

Other functions at/involving WPLC: Choir Music Sunday, May 23; church clean-up; Worship and Music Committee; Finance Committee – meeting with Nolan Accounting; Confirmation Sunday, May 23; nursery meeting, May 23; Special Congregational Meeting to approve the expenditure for a new Parking Lot, May 23; Bless the Years Sunday, May 2; Luther Manor Sunday, May 2; 37 members and friends of WPLC visit the Dead Sea Scrolls exhibit at the Milwaukee Public Museum.

Local Pastors Meetings: Cluster III Pastor's Pericope Studies, Tuesdays @ Noon; CPE – Final Evaluation; Veterans Task Force Meetings, Preparing for Synod Assembly.

Other church business: continuing the process of changing financial accounting practices at WPLC.

## COMMITTEE REPORTS

### **Christian Education – Jennine Sonntag**

The "Summer Fellowship Event" will take place on Sunday, July 25, beginning in the late afternoon and will include dinner, a craft, separate bible studies for kids and adults and games. Also discussed how the youth group is doing (not well) and discussed the possibility of finding a new youth leader who is a young adult.

### **Endowment – Betty Hembrook**

The Endowment Committee received thank you notes from Maria Peyer and Katie Katschke for the scholarships. Scholarships will be presented to seven WPLC graduating seniors on Sunday, June 13 at the 10:00 service. This is the greatest number of scholarships that the committee has ever given out at one time. The Endowment Board will be having a meeting some time before June 13, but the date has not yet been determined. Donating \$5,000 to the mortgage fund will be discussed.

### **Finance – Van Johnson**

Associated Bank is charging us a service fee of \$145/month! We have to find out what this is and ask them to drop it or else start investigating other nearby banks that we can potentially switch to. We need a bank that is close to the church and one that will let us use a private room for counting on Mondays. Nolan Accounting will enter all of our expenditures for the past year for free if they are available.

### **Fellowship – Sandy Sannes**

The Rummage & Bake Sale generated \$4,578.87. The Whitnall Friendship Circle will donate an even \$5,000 to the parking lot fund. There is no longer a matching funds program through Thrivent Insurance. The Friendship Circle and the Property Committee are planning an Antique Appraisal event on June 26. We need to get this information out to the community to draw in more people. The council also discussed some new ideas for the Fellowship Committee such as organizing receptions for various occasions, like the Sunday that new members join or Confirmation Sunday.

### **Health and Wellness – Jill Underberg**

A representative from Lifeline Screening will attend the next Health and Wellness meeting to present information and answer questions about a potential program that we will have at WPLC on a weekday during which people can be screened for various serious health conditions for a fee.

### **Worship and Music – Donna Winiarski**

There have been some problems with Acolytes not showing up for their assigned service. Pastor has sent out letters to all Acolytes regarding this problem and asked them to show up when scheduled.

### **Property – Van Johnson**

Work on the new parking lot will start on June 1. Suburban Asphalt agreed to shave their price down to \$61,000 conditioned on starting immediately, which will save us \$1,700. Suburban requires one-half of the contract amount to be paid prior to starting work and the remainder upon completion. The parking lot will be unavailable for only six days, provided that the weather cooperates. The parking lot fund received another \$2,000 gift. We currently have \$33,700.

***Motion made and passed*** that Lou will sign the contract with Suburban Asphalt for the contract price of \$61,000.

### **Publicity/Evangelism – Gloria Brinkmeier**

Roger Brinkmeier has enhanced our website. ### **Stewardship – Sandy Sannes**

The 10 remaining people who have not picked up their 2010 envelopes have been sent a letter by Pastor.

### **Audit – Van Johnson**

There are plans to do an audit after Nolan Accounting has taken over the accounting function.

### **Old Business**

**Scheduling of Annual and Semi-Annual Congregational meetings** – elections of council positions should be held at the winter meeting in February. Council members, therefore, will extend their terms until the first council meeting after the February congregational meeting. Donna, Lou and Jennine will end their terms in March, 2012. Gloria, Van, Jill and Kurt will end their terms in March, 2011. The Semi-Annual Meeting will be held on September 26, 2010.

**Associate in Ministry (AIM)** – We are now at the point in the life of WPLC that we could use another staff person. Our worship services have been steadily growing in attendance and we have had a number of new people join us recently and more people have expressed an interest in joining. Our congregation is growing. Available statistics tell us that, for the number of people that we have attending worship services, we should really have the assistance of an AIM. An Associate in Ministry could assist Pastor with some tasks so that he can lead additional Bible studies, and do other tasks. We think that a part-time AIM (20 hours/week) would cost approximately \$25,000. A WPLC member has generously offered to fund one-half of the cost of this position. Pastor will approach the Endowment Committee to ask if it will fund the other half. This help in paying for an AIM is not expected to be permanent. We will eventually have our mortgage paid off and will have those funds available. Pastor has begun to develop a draft of a job description that he could share with the Endowment Committee.

***Motion made and passed*** to move forward with the AIM position.

**Memorial** – The Grafwallner family wants to donate a memorial. They would like to have a stained glass window. Discussions with the family will be continuing.

The next meeting will be held on June 22, 2010.

## ***Social Ministry Committee Activities— Hope House***

Remember to bring non-perishable food items for Hope House. The items are delivered monthly. Donations were way down in June, but food items are desperately needed to help people in these turbulent economic times.

### ***Fresh Garden Produce Table***

August is the height of the growing season in Wisconsin. Take advantage of the Produce Table while you can. Members of the congregation are encouraged to bring in their surplus garden produce. Other members then can take the abundance home for a small donation. This year the money raised will go to the following causes:

- ELCA World Hunger
- Hunger Task Force
- Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin.

Thrivent Financial for Lutherans is providing matching funds.

### ***CROP Walk***

Walkers reserve Sunday afternoon, October 10th, for this year's CROP Walk. Persons are also needed to collect donations on Sundays, September 26th and October 17th. Thrivent Financial for Lutherans is providing matching funds.

### ***Thrivent Matching Funds***

Thrivent Financial for Lutherans has provided Whitnall Park with matching funds from its Care Abounds in Communities Program. The Produce Table was awarded \$450 and the CROP Walk \$800. Thrivent will match every dollar raised at the rate of fifty cents on a dollar up to the amount of the grant. To obtain all of the matching funds \$900 and \$1,600 will have to be raised for each project, respectively.

## ***Lutheran World Relief School Kits***

Walgreens had the first school supplies on sale (10 pencils for 19 cents) beginning with the Fourth of July weekend. Enough pencils, both leftovers from last year and new purchases, have been accumulated for 200 school kits. Also enough pencil sharpeners are on hand to fill 400 school kits. So just buy more pencils when they are on sale for now and avoid buying pencil sharpeners. Last year rulers, erasers, crayons, scissors, and spiral notebooks were needed in greater quantities. They also are the more expensive items. Try to take advantage of "back to school sales" because only one child is helped by a 79 cents ruler while four children can be helped if the same amount is spent on four rulers on sale at 19 cents each.

Please help to fill school bags for eager, but impoverished, school children in the United States and around the world. You have the option of filling a complete bag with the eight items needed, buying an item or two in bulk, or donating money. Money would allow the Social Ministry Committee to purchase items that are needed to fill out complete kits.

### **The eight items needed for each bag are as follows:**

- **Three 70-page spiral notebooks, for a total of 210 pages for each school kit.**
- **One pink pencil eraser about two and one half inches long.**
- **One BLUNT TIP scissors with metal blades.**
- **One pencil sharpener. (Needed only for complete kits as there are 400 on hand.)**
- **One ruler with 12 inches on the top and 30 cm (*The rulers must have the 30 cm.*) on the bottom of the front side. Flat wood (or plastic) rulers are easiest to pack.**
- **One box of 24 crayons.**
- **Six new unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers.**
- **12 sheets of construction paper.**

# Footprints

## IN THE SAND



Try this craft at the beach, at the park or in your own sandbox at home. It will remind you whose footprints we should follow.

### What you need:

- Plaster of Paris
- Sand (beach, park or sandbox)
- Small shells (optional)
- Water
- Small bowl
- Stick, toothpick or skewer (optional)



### What you do:

1. Find some moist sand by digging down a little.
2. With a bare foot, make a footprint in the sand.
3. (Optional) Place shells face down on the toe imprints as toenails.
4. Follow the plaster of Paris directions for mixing the dry plaster with water in bowl.
5. Fill the footprint with the plaster and smooth the surface.
6. (Optional) Using a stick, toothpick or skewer, write "Direct my footsteps" (Psalm 119:133) or "Follow Me" (John 10:27).
7. When dry, place the foot in your garden, yard or room.
8. Remember to turn the foot over to remind yourself of whose footprints we should follow, and that we are never alone.


